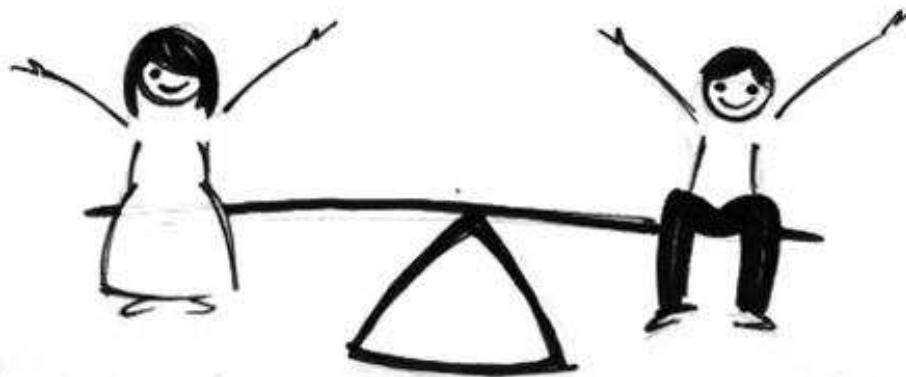

1. Rationale

(Gerry: It's not good to start with a "negative point". I prefer something like –
"A large number of women are engaged in economic activities and micro-enterprises. Many of them have no alternative source of livelihood.")

Many of them operate in a poor working environment with little prospect of being able to work their way out of poverty.

Most training programmes ignore or overlook the problems faced by these dynamic yet vulnerable women." (Susanne: I agree with this comment)

⇒ **Weaknesses in existing training materials on women's enterprise development**

- welfare approach
- business know-how only: too high level
- inadequate attention to gender-specific constraints and needs of poor women

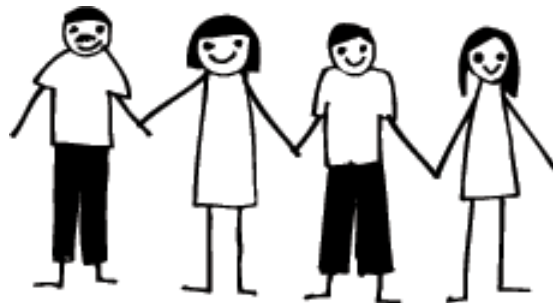


4. For whom?

5. Aims & Strategy

Aim: Enable low-income women entrepreneurs and their families to shift from marginal income earning to profitable business development

Strategy:

- strengthening capacity of **governments and ILO constituents and** partner organizations to promote women's **entrepreneurship** development and gender equality
- field-testing and adaptation with business and gender trainers networks in participating countries to expand decent work opportunities for women in enterprise in family and community

- strong and successful business women as role models
- uses **s** both female and male trainers

- To promote women's economic **and** social empowerment among low-income groups,
- to **encourage** providing equal opportunities to **women and men** in enterprise development
- to **help women develop** a business perspective in small-scale income earning and in businesses of low-income women and their families
- To **stir** capacity **development for providing** action-oriented, participatory training on basic business management skills **geared towards** low-income women and their families
