- Partnered with the InterAmerican Institute for Cooperation in Agriculture to offer CVQs in schools for the summer programme

- Partnered with the Caribbean Maritime Institute to offer CVQ at the Barbados Port Inc
- Signed MOUS with the major training institutions (SJPP, BVTB, BCC) MOUs also with Barbados Coalition of Service Industries (BCSI) and City & Guilds.
- In discussions with Barbados Institute for Management and Productivity and Caribbean Maritime Institute to offer CVQs both locally and regionally

#### SUCESSES

- Have acquired the training and capacity to develop curricula materials for the standards and offer Prior Learning and Assessment Recognition (PLAR) services
